Political Turmoil

The political situation in the capital, Port Au Prince is serious and gang violence is continuing.

In July 2021, the Haitian president Jovenel Moise, was assassinated at his home in the capital - Port Au Prince and his wife was seriously injured. In the aftermath of his death, there has been a serious paralysis at the heart of the Haitian government which has led to a dangerous power vacuum and battle for the control of the country. No new elections have been called to allow a democratic appointment of a new president and various politically motivated gangs have taken over large parts of the capital in an effort to gain overall control.

As part of their generation of funding, there has been a steady stream of kidnappings for ransom in and around the capital city, making it very difficult for progress to be made. The situation is sufficiently serious that the acting president Ariel Henry has approached the United Nations asking for military help to resolve the issues they face. Of-course for a country that was already one of the poorest in the world, this crisis of government is exacerbating the chronic poverty and distress felt by the ordinary citizens.



There does not appear to be any easy resolution to the problem humanly speaking. Perhaps Haiti's greatest need right now is simply an army of Christians, praying for God to intervene and to show mercy to this broken country. We pray for restoration of the political institutions and for Godly men to take over leadership positions.
